From the Vicarage

I was reading recently a theologian pondering on the decision that God took in deciding the way in which he would come to the help of his



world in the first Christmas. There are presumably many ways that he could have done it (beyond our comprehension and imagination) but he chose to be born of a virgin, by the power of the Holy Spirit as a baby in a manger in an occupied country just over 2,000 years ago and to grow up and live life as a man. That he was God was clear from his life, teaching and miracles but that he was human is clear from the fact that many who met him did not believe him or come to believe in him. Even his brothers and sisters were sceptical until after the crucifixion and resurrection. To us, the life of Jesus is of ultimate importance as it is the fullest revelation we have of the nature of God.

The choice He made was the closest and most intimate way that God could enter his creation. Emptying himself of the glory of heaven he submitted himself entirely to a life of sacrifice. He did not need to do this for his own needs. This was a sacrifice of a perfect love that we find hard to grasp. We perhaps get glimpses of it in our better moments, and perhaps in the love of a parent for a child but they still cannot be compared to what the son of God did in being born as a baby that first Christmas.

How do we see Jesus? That is the challenge of Christmas. Do we look into the manger and see a cute baby or do we fall down and worship as the wise men did?

It is going to be a very different Christmas this year. Maybe allow the absence of some of the trimmings to bring you the essence of what happened. That may be the best Christmas present ever.

The Byrne family in Kings Ride have now collected no less than an amazing 1729 donations since March 2020, which is approx. 216 cans per month. The One Can charity tell us that currently 90% of their donations come from places like this, so makes every can count. In October they were feeding 422 people, of which 218 are children. You can still give. There are boxes in the porches of both Holy Trinity and St Margaret's Churches and also at 11 Kings Ride.

At the moment, they are particularly in need of tinned ham, fresh vegetables (carrots and potatoes), tinned vegetables, cooking sauces, cooking oil, healthy cereals, washing up liquid, and baby wipes. However, nothing goes to waste, so whatever you can spare.

Marriage of Paul Goodchild and Kate Clements

Congratulations to Paul Goodchild and Kate Clements who got married at St Margaret's Church on Wednesday 4th November 2020 (the day before the new restrictions came into force!). We wish them a long and happy marriage.

Great Lives -Flora Murray and Louisa Garrett Anderson

In a quiet corner of Penn churchyard lies this memorial stone celebrating the lives and work of these two amazing women doctors. Louisa was following in the footsteps of her mother, Elizabeth Garrett Anderson who was the first British woman to qualify as a doctor.

At the time of the outbreak of World War 1 women doctors were not normally allowed to treat male patients. These two women had shown themselves to be very doughty and courageous, (they had both been involved in the suffragette movement before the war) and they were so determined to care for injured soldiers that they went to Paris in 1914 where they opened a hospital in what had previously been a luxury hotel.

Excellent reports of their work in France reached the war office in the UK and the following year they were invited to return to this country and open a hospital in London. Endell Street Military Hospital (very close to Covent Garden) opened its doors in May 1915. It was run by women and almost entirely staffed by women.

Flora Murray was the doctor in charge and used her skills as an anaesthetist, while Louisa Garrett Anderson was the chief surgeon. They were known amongst the staff of the hospital as the COs.

When Endell Street closed its doors in 1919 around 26,000 patients had been treated. In spite of having no previous experience of dealing with horrific war wounds the doctors at Endell Street rapidly became very proficient at dealing with them and the army chiefs were amazed at their success. In recognition of their work they were both awarded CBEs in 1917.



There are distinct similarities with our situation today as the Spanish 'flu epidemic struck in 1918 and the staff at Endell Street treated many patients with the disease. Sadly several dozen patients died of the disease and also a few of the staff. (In those days there were no antiviral medicines or antibiotics to treat the pneumonia that often occurred).

I found the story of these 2 women of particular interest as I did my nursing training in the Nightingale school at St Thomas's Hospital in London. Florence Nightingale was also a pioneer in her field. She was very convinced about the importance of good hygiene and was particularly keen on hand washing. This year in May we were going to celebrate the 200th anniversary of her birth. Unfortunately, like so many other events, the celebrations could not happen in May but hopefully may be held at a future date. One interesting connection with our two local celebrated women is that Louisa Garrett Anderson signed Florence Nightingale's death certificate in 1910.

The arrival of the railways early in the last century enabled people working in London to live in areas outside the city.



Flora Murray and Louisa Garrett Anderson owned a house in Pauls Hill and lived there full time after the war.

Flora died in 1923. Louisa lived on in the area. She was a magistrate and became only the second woman to be elected to Penn Parish Council on which she served from 1923 – 1940 with a particular interest in the War Memorial. She died in 1943 and left a very generous bequest to Penn Church.


A book about Endell Street by Wendy Moore has just been published this year and I look forward to reading it with great interest.


